April 2022 Key Report – Legislation

When it comes to paid leave, the United States stands out – and not in a good way.



Unlike the majority of developed countries worldwide, the United States does not guarantee paid annual leave, paid time off for illness or family care, or paid parental leave. Without these policies, balancing the responsibilities of work and family can be difficult for employees, negatively impacting productivity, making recovery from major illnesses or injuries difficult, and in some cases inhibiting the healthy development of children. In addition, for the millions of Americans without paid sick days, a decision to stay home to care for a sick child or family member could jeopardize their job or family income. For many Americans, this unpaid time off work is untenable and it threatens their economic security.

The 117th Congress must take steps to provide greater support to American workers trying to meet the demands of work and life. Passage of the Family and Medical Insurance Leave (FAMILY) Act (**H.R. 804/S. 248**), would create a national self-funding paid family and medical leave insurance program.

Women disproportionately bear the economic opportunity cost of providing care for children or elderly family members, or doing things like taking them to the doctor. Yet many women delay seeking health care for themselves because they cannot take time off work, affecting their abilities as employees and primary caregivers. Paid leave not only improves health outcomes for parents and children, it means women don't have to choose between their own health needs, the health needs of their family or their job. (AAUW)

In my last *Key* report, I highlighted the six states in the Northeast that have paid family leave. Passage of the bipartisan Family Care Act (**PA S. 580**) would establish a statewide family and medical leave insurance program, ensuring Pennsylvania stays competitive with surrounding states. No one should have to choose between caring for a newborn or sick loved one and keeping their job.

It's time for Pennsylvania and the United States to guarantee paid family leave and the PA Senate leadership to bring this bill up for a vote ASAP.

PA AFFILIATE CHAPTER OF THE NFBPWC HAS NEWS

Our group is not only affiliated with the National Federation of Business and Professional Women's Clubs, Inc., we also belong to the International BPW. The NFBPWC was founded in 1919 under the leadership of Lena Madesin Phillips. She was not the first president, but she was the executive secretary. In 1926, Lena finally consented to be our fourth National Federation BPW President. It was right after her term of office that she took many BPW sisters and traveled to Europe. Lena wanted to expand the organization. In 1930, she had enlisted many of our European countries and International BPW was formed. Today there are 105 nations that belong to International which are divided into 5 areas all around the world. The reason I share this background is to explain what we have learned during the past month.

We have all been watching the conflict in the Ukraine and Russia. I don't wish to be political but we heard from our International President Catherine Bosshart of Switzerland. Early last month, she had active in communications with our BPW sisters in both countries. But she has lost all information from our Russian BPW members. As for our Ukrainian sisters, we have those who are fleeing to other neighboring countries. President Bosshart and the many European BPW sisters are coming to their aide.

We have heard President Biden pledge to accept 100,000 Ukrainians. Already NFBPWC is thinking ahead on how we can help these women. If you remember in the last issue, I shared how we are the only organization to be approved by the U.S. State Department to work with the Afghan women. It is our hopes that our model textbook will be revised to work with our Ukraine women.

Our work with the Afghan women in Colorado and New York continues. Many Afghan women have professional and business backgrounds. All are eager to learn the computer and laptops. They are learning about our social ways in America and are learning English. Our BPW sisters are really doing a great job learning the Afghan languages. But the Afghan women are optimistic that they will soon be relocated to communities that they can be an active participant.

I just wished to share that the National Federation and the International Federation are actively trying to "make a difference" for all women and their families.

Spring is nature's way of saying "Let's Party!" -




January was our re-gifting raffle. All of the proceeds went towards postage for the soldier care packages. Theme was Pajama / spa party.


