 - "Grow Through What You Go Through." What does it mean to you and why is it an important philosophy to embrace?
- 4. You must present this prepared speech to your club (prior to April 5, 2024) and be promoted to the District level.

<u>Young Careerist</u> Potential Candidate Prerequisites for competing at the district/state level include:

- 1. Open to Members in Good Standing Ages 21-35
- 2. Recommended to have completed (but not mandatory) the PPDW (Personal and Professional Development Workshop) within the past three years.
- 3. You must have a prepared 5 minute speech on one of the following questions:
 - What does the BPW/PA state theme, "Grow through what you go through" mean to you and how do you or have you implemented the theme in your life?
 - What does the BPW/PA state theme, "Grow through what you go through" mean to you and how do you or have you implemented the theme in your life?
 - How is the BPW/PA state theme "Grow through what you go through" relevant to women, specifically?
- 4. You must present this prepared speech to your club (prior to April 5, 2024) and be promoted to the District level
