

September's Guest Speaker was Lillian Bailey

Lillian Bailey, sister of member Dorothy Gruskowski, was our speaker for September. Lillian presented a program on Dress A Girl Around the World. Dress a Girl is part of Hope 4 Women International, a faith-based organization who serves women and girls at risk and believes everyone is worthy of love and respect.



Dress A Girl Around the World delivers dresses and hope to girls in need and who are at risk around the world. In receiving "God's best dress," not only are the girls being gifted with what could be their first ever new dress, they are also receiving the organization's 4 Pillars of Hope: *Dignity, Health, Joy, and Love*.

How does the organization get dresses to distribute? Volunteers can donate fabric, cut out patterns, sew dresses, donate financially, or help in other ways. Since 2009, over 2 million dresses have been made/distributed. With an annual dress goal of 100,000, there is a lot of sewing going on. Dresses are given two pockets and a Dress a Girl label on the front. Cloth dolls are also made.

Lillian got involved with Dress a Girl when she saw an article in a church bulletin and joined the church's Dress a Girl Ministry in the fall of 2022. As 4-H member in her youth and an avid sewer who made most of her clothes during high school and college (but had not sewn for some time), she dusted off her sewing machine, joined the group of enthusiastic and encouraging women, and began cutting patterns and sewing dresses. She set a personal goal of one dress a week and at the time of her presentation, Lillian has made 47 dresses. Lillian shared several dresses and dolls that she has made. She's on track to meet her goal by the end of her first year.

Where do the dresses go? Dress A Girl has Ambassadors who collect the finished dresses and are the ones who receive requests for dresses. The dresses, each with a Dress A Girl label and pockets, are hand delivered by a missionary or someone who is returning to the area. Each dress is presented to the girl, put on her, she is told God loves her, and someone made this dress especially for her. The dresses have gone to the Congo, Uganda, Kyrgyzstan, Belize, USA, Israel, France, and Thailand to name a few. (Lillian's sister counted the countries listed on the website and totaled 97 countries—literally countries around the world.)

NATIONAL WORLD MENTAL HEALTH DAY | OCTOBER 10

Annually, World Mental Health Day on October 10th raises awareness and mobilizes efforts to support mental health.

Mental health is a hot topic. This is good news. It means the stigma for mental health issues is slowly going away. Mental health issues are finally getting the attention they deserve. Healthcare workers and individuals feel they can discuss mental health more openly. However, that doesn't mean there isn't still work to do.



As a whole, we often misunderstand mental health because it is hard to define. Additionally, mental health includes several areas. These areas involve one's social, emotional, and psychological well-being. Mental health affects thoughts, feelings, and actions. When we have positive mental health, we handle stress better, our productivity remains stable, and we realize our full potential.

When one has poor mental health, they are more likely to suffer from a mental health disorder. These disorders include the following diagnoses:

- Depression
- Generalized Anxiety Disorder (GAD)
- Panic disorder
- Phobias

- Social Anxiety Disorder (SAD)
- Obsessive-compulsive Disorder (OCD)
- Post-traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)

Of these mental health disorders, most people experience anxiety disorders. Statistics show that about 4% of the world's population has a form of anxiety disorder. In the United States, the percentage increases to just over 18% of the population.

Some people are at a higher risk of getting a mental health disorder. These include those with high-stress levels, those who have experienced trauma, and those who have few healthy relationships. However, family history plays a role in higher risk factors, too.

Thanks to increased awareness and increased funding for research, there are effective treatment options for most mental health disorders. Conventional treatment methods include medication, psychotherapy, and hospital and residential programs.

HOW TO OBSERVE MENTAL HEALTH DAY

The World Federation for Mental Health organizes World Mental Health Day. Each year, organizations host a variety of events to increase awareness about mental health issues. Events include educational seminars, free mental health screenings, walk-a-thons, marathons, conferences, mass media promotions, and public service announcements.

If you know someone who struggles with a mental health disorder, World Mental Health Day is a great way to reach out to them. While many people don't feel comfortable talking to others about their diagnosis, knowing they have someone to reach out to makes a real difference. You can also donate to an organization that advocates for mental health.


